In the winter months, it is not uncommon for veterinarians to see cats being brought in with extensive burns, degloved tails, or worse. This winter, take precautions to help cats out of this dangerous spot. Try to get in the habit of doing a quick check for unwanted passengers before you start your car. A quick bang on the hood or beep of your horn might be enough to scare the tiny hitchhiker away. Do not start your engine prior to checking! It is also recommended to peek under your vehicle and on top of your tires to see if there is anything snuggled up in a spot only safe when stationary. Make sure to give them a minute to scramble out just in case they were in a deep sleep. These quick tricks could quite literally save a life.

COVID-19 cases are rapidly rising in Kansas. Stay home, gather virtually, or outdoors in small groups. As cold weather moves in and we begin to spend more time indoors closer together, the virus can spread more easily. It's more important than ever that we remain vigilant and take steps to protect ourselves and our loved ones: • Stay home when possible. • If you go out of the house, be sure to wear a mask over your mouth AND nose. • Stay at least 6 feet apart from people who do not live in your household and avoid crowds. • Wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds.

Kansas City, Kansas Municipal Court to Close Until January 18, 2021. Temporary closure in response to increasing COVID-19 cases The Unified Government announced today that the Kansas City, Kansas Municipal Court will be closed from December 1, 2020, to January 18, 2021. The closure is part of the County's ongoing efforts to increase public safety and reduce the spread of COVID-19. This temporary closure applies to all cases except for Domestic Violence and necessary trials. Hearings that are currently scheduled will be rescheduled for a date after January 18, 2021. "The decision to close the court to all cases except Domestic Violence and necessary trials was not made lightly," said Municipal Court Administrator Dominic Geniuk. "This change allows for an immediate decrease of persons entering the building, making the spread of COVID-19 less likely for both the public and our staff remaining in City Hall." In spite of the temporary closure, Court Officials emphasize that many interactions with the Court can be conducted online at wycokck.org/Municipal Through this site, the public can: • Download the myWyCo app, through which they can pay municipal court tickets, and set a court date and payment reminders. • Request a video hearing • Connect with Unified Government Digital Services • Check Court dates or balances • Request certified records • Submit something to the court • Request a continuance • View Administrative Operations or Jail Orders If you have questions about the Municipal Court's temporary closing, visit wycokck.org/Municipal call 3-1-1, or email the Municipal Court at kckmunicourt@wycokck.org
