It is very important that you have a trusted family member or friend on your stock certificate or a TOD (Transfer on Death) or a will specific to your unit. If you do not have a will or a TOD designating who will receive your unit upon your death, then the unit will go into a legal process to determine heirs or potential recipients of the unit. This process can take over a year and financial obligations could be incurred. Plan for your future and the Homes future. TOD's are available at the office and can be notarized by our staff or any other notary.
